I have been really concerned about this, because that is one of the main reasons we joined FMCA in the first place. Usually, it's the governing board, made up of all chapter National Directors, who get to vote on decisions like this, but with this pandemic they are going a different route and voting in our place, which is allowed under FMCA bylaws, and policies and procedures. The big FMCA rallies for this year were canceled and that has really caused a big money loss for FMCA. They are really in a quandary on how to balance the budget for this year.
